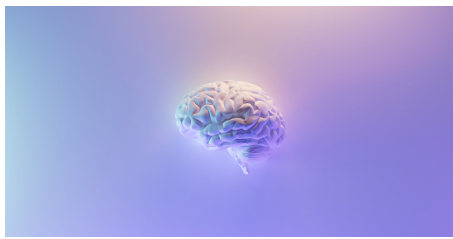
# FISSION: BUILDING BLOCKS FOR TFT

- Building on top of IPFS as a global collaborative file system: public and private data, linked by content address and versioned
- Identity: portable, DID-based
- Data: user-centric, available on all devices
- Publishing: create apps, user subdomains & DNS automation
- Future: multi-player, collaborative editing, and datalog-inspired decentralized database
